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Tenant-In-Common Association Foundation Donation Helps Three New Orleans Teachers Rebuild Homes Damaged in Hurricanes

INDIANAPOLIS — May 12, 2009 — The Tenant-In-Common Association (TICA) Foundation donated approximately \$25,000 over the past year to the Louisiana Disaster Recovery Foundation (LDRF) in New Orleans. This donation will help three teachers rebuild their homes which were damaged in Hurricane Katrina.

The TICA Foundation was formed in 2006 in the wake of Hurricane Katrina because of the members' strong desire to help the victims of the natural disaster. TICA members recognize that real estate is an important step toward an individual's and family's financial security. Therefore, the TICA Foundation joined with the LDRF to advance social justice in real estate and give back to the community.

"The TICA Foundation is committed to the prosperity of communities and the rebuilding of real estate damaged by natural disasters," said Marc Paul, president of the TICA Foundation. "Our donation is a reflection of the generosity and compassion TICA members have for their communities and real estate."

Since hurricanes Katrina and Rita, the LDRF has worked with neighborhood groups, charitable organizations and others to provide funds to rebuild Louisiana. To date, the LDRF has provided support of over \$29 million dollars to 150 organizations to help provide affordable housing, incentives for businesses to return to New Orleans and to restore infrastructure to the area.

"We are extremely pleased to have partners like TICA who understand the need and are willing to commit resources to the important task of rebuilding homes in a post-Katrina storm damaged environment," said Landon Williams, LDRF Director for Housing and Small Business. "Teachers are vital anchors in the community that stabilize the young minds in their classrooms. Many teachers are challenged daily to help shape young malleable children while simultaneously coping with the loss of their own homes and family possessions. TICA's support has helped us to keep teachers who are committed to

remain in the community focused on the young people under their charge instead of personal losses. Assisting these teachers has been an honor that we share with our friends at TICA.”
